<p>Upon the completion of this lesson, Students will be able to:</p> <p>Identify the letter sound of 't' as initial and ending sound</p>	<p>Start Up: Show small and capital letter and ask which is small / which is capital? Ask sound.</p> <p>Introduction: Show letter 't' flashcard and utter /t/ sound loud in the class and ask students to repeat it. Play letter 't' story and song. Ask students to listen it carefully. (Note: teacher can either play the video or can tell a story)</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ooMfh.3OBY2Y</p> <p>Storyline for the 't' sound: Some children go to a tennis match between two famous people. They have great fun watching the match. They watch the people opposite them turning their heads from side to side. The children join in turning their heads every time they hear the 't' sound of the racket hitting the ball.</p> <p>Action: ask students to imitate watching tennis turning head from side to side and saying t t t.</p> <p>Flashcard: Show the letter Tt both capital and small.</p> <p>Letter Formation: Teacher shows how to form the small letter t (e.g. long line down, short line across). Show how to form capital letter T (e.g. long line down, short line on the top). Students will form the letter in the air'. Tell students that 't' is a sky letter and it is written between sky and grass line.</p> <p>Focused Task: Ask students to open book page 40. Read the rhyme and ask students to repeat after you.</p> <p>Tiger and Turtle clean their teeth with toothpaste. /t/ /t/ /t/</p> <p>Help students to read words given on page 41. Help them to identify 't' as initial and ending sound. Write words like tree, table and cat, hat on board and ask students to identify and circle the 't' as initial and ending sound.</p> <p>Wrap up: Show the words flashcards and ask students to tell the beginning and ending sound.</p> <p>Reflection :</p>	<p>Students will be assessed on identifying the letter sound of 't' as initial and ending sound</p>	<p>Flash cards</p>
